Scioto County Developmental Disabilities will host a pair of meetings to address any local concerns about proposed changes to the state's Medicaid waiver waiting list.

The sessions will be at 12:30 p.m., Monday, May 14, and 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, May 15, at the Vern Riffe School building at 2619 Gallia St., Portsmouth. The SCDD's Service & Support Administration department will be hosting the events for those who would like to attend in person. Of

course, stakeholders may also call their Service & Support Administrator for information about the waiver waiting list changes that may affect them.

Fix The List is an effort of a coalition of organizations such as local boards of developmental disabilities, Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities, People First of Ohio, the Ohio Self Determination Association, and the Ohio Developmental Disabilities Council, which

are advocating for the standardization, simplification, and transparency of what is currently a complex and often confusing waiting list system.


The PTO at VRS uses fundraisers and donations throughout the year to provide additional supports that directly benefit students.

## **Legislative Corner**

## Bills Introduced on PERS Issue Affecting 9- and 10-Month Board Employees

Ohio Association of County Boards Bills have been introduced to align the PERS credit accrual rate for 9and 10-month employees with other state retirement systems. HB 547 (introduced by Rep. Jay Edwards, R-Athens County) and HB 572 (introduced by Reps. Gary Scherer, R-Pickaway County, and Stephanie Howse, D-Cuyahoga County) would both allow non-teaching 9- and 10-month employees whose pay is spread over

12 months to accrue a full year of retirement service credit for each calendar year (as is currently allowed in SERS and STRS).

HB 413 (introduced by Rep. Scherer in November) also includes this OACB

language. However, the bill remains pending the House Aging and Long Term Care Committee as members continue to review controversial language unrelated to OACB's provision.

OACB will continue to work with legislative leadership to advance this issue in the House. The association will update members in future versions of the PolicyBrief and OACB Bill Tracker as opportunities arise to participate in the advocacy process.
