## **Board Notes**

The Scioto County Board of Developmental Disabilities met at 4:45 p.m., April 18. In addition to routine business, the Board took the following actions:

- Approved renewal of the META contract for IT services at VRS and the Carousel Center.
- Received an update on upcoming renovations at VRS and Carousel Center.
- Received notification a policy is in progress for use of Narcan in the VRS and Carousel Center buildings at the discretion of the Superintendent. The policy should be available for review at May's meeting.
- Received verbal invitations to the VRS Prom on May 10, and VRS Graduation on May 24.

The Board also met at 4:45 p.m., May 16. In addition to routine business, the Board took the following actions:

- Approved two Direct Service contracts.
- Received a report from Personnel Committee Chair, and tabled discussion until next committee meeting.
- Approved allowing the Superintendent to require current Instructional Aides to obtain the "No Child Left Behind" credential which requires passing an evaluation to demonstrate knowledge and classroom ability. The Board also approved establishing a timeline for current Instructional Aides to prepare for and pass the evaluation. It was noted any new Instructional Aides would be required to obtain the credential within 90 days.
- Approved funding for a permanent wheelchair ramp for the stage in the VRS gymnasium.

The next Board meeting will be 4:45 p.m., Thursday, June 20.

## **Legislative Update**

## OACB testifies on amended state budget bill; budget analysis updated to reflect House changes

Speaking on behalf of OACB, Licking DD Super-intendent Jason Umstot presented oral testimony Tuesday regarding DD-related provisions in Am. Sub. HB 166, the two-year state budget bill (download current bill language).

HB 166 was passed by the Ohio House of Representatives 85-9 last week and includes a number of changes affecting DD budget provisions. The bill is now being considered by the Ohio Senate.

Umstot's testimony addressed positive changes in the House's version of the budget (such as additional

state funds for an improved DSP wage increase) as well as areas of concern (including a duplicative NMT workgroup, inappropriate early intervention earmarks, tax issues, and other topics).

## Updated Budget Analysis Available

OACB has prepared a fully updated version of its biennial budget analysis to reflect changes made by the House to HB 166. Please note that provisions removed by the House will not appear in future versions of this document unless reinserted by

the Senate.

## Next Steps in Budget Process

The bill was introduced in the Ohio Senate on May 13 and referred to the full Senate Finance Committee on May 14. A full Senate vote is anticipated in early June. The differences between the House and Senate versions of the bill will be reconciled in a conference committee. Gov. DeWine must sign the budget by June 30.
