Monroe Resigns as SCDD Superintendent Board Promotes Fiscal/HR Director Matt Purcell; Contract to Start Jan. 6

Scioto County Developmental Disabilities Superintendent Julie Monroe notified the Board at its Thursday, Dec. 21, meeting that she intends to step down in January. At the same meeting, the board hired Director of Fiscal/Human Resources Matt Purcell to succeed her as superintendent.

"The Board accepted the resignation of Julie Monroe with regret, and we wish Ms. Monroe nothing but success in her new position and thanked her for her 20 years of dedication to the program," said Board President Rodney Barnett.

Monroe's last day at SCDD will be Friday, Jan. 5, and Purcell's contract as superintendent begins Saturday, Jan. 6.

Monroe has been part of a service-sharing agreement between SCDD and Lawrence County since August. She was offered the superintendent position at Lawrence County Board of DD and accepted.

"I have truly enjoyed serving the Scioto County Developmental Disabilities programs in all of my professional roles," Monroe said. "I have witnessed a lot of positive growth in our programs throughout my years of employment, and consider myself fortunate to have had the opportunity to work with the individuals served, families, providers, and community stakeholders. The Board and staff members truly care about working to improve the quality of life for individuals with developmental disabilities, and I have no doubt the agency will continue to move forward."

Monroe was promoted to superintendent in August 2014. She has also served as an Individual Support Facilitator in the Adult Services program, a Service and Support Administrator, and Director of Community Services.

"The last four years during Julie's tenure and with the Board's leadership has been a time of tremendous positive growth of our programming," Purcell said. "I'm looking forward to continuing and building on those successes with our staff, administrative team, and with the support of our Board."

Purcell has worked in a variety of positions at SCDD over the last 17 years – the last 10 years as Director of Fiscal/Human Resources. The Board offered, and Purcell accepted, a two-year contract, and Barnett said Purcell's salary will remain as-is for the first year but will be re-evaluated during his annual performance review.

"We felt as a Board we already had someone on staff who was very credentialed to assume the role of superintendent," Barnett said. "With Mr. Purcell, we chose an individual with sound fiscal management, someone who is very caring and very dedicated to all aspects of the program and one we felt who was a go-to person in recent years."

Barnett said the Board looked to Purcell's sound fiscal management and dedication to all facets of the program when considering the hire.

The Board will host a reception at January's meeting to honor Monroe for her years of dedication and service. The next meeting will be at 4:45 p.m., Thursday, Jan. 18, at STAR, Inc., 2625 Gallia St.

'Tis the season, after all! It's also the season for making sure your one-call information is updated with the Fiscal/HR office.

Scioto County Developmental

Disabilities has a notificationsystem that allows us to quickly communicate important information to our stakeholders. This can include staff, students' families, individuals, and members of the community. This is the point of contact used for such things as inclement weather closures and emergencies.

In order for this system to be successful, we need up-to-date contact information.

When a new staff member starts at SCDD, they fill out a form for our School Messenger, or one-cal, system. The staff member can choose to include one or all of such things as home number, mobile number, email, and whether they would like to receive texts from us regarding important things such as program closures, delays, and important upcoming events.

The employee must opt-in when they receive the text from School Messenger, however, in order to get the texts. Do not ignore this message if you want to get

Only a few people can send one-call notifications. I am one of them, as is our Superintendent. We try to get information out as quickly and accurately as possible on a variety of platforms, with the safety of the individuals we serve and staff being top priorities.

Your contact information will be kept private. It will allow you to have the most immediate knowledge of any program schedule changes. Phone calls will show up as coming from Vern Riffe School.

So ... have you gotten a new cell phone recently? Maybe you've changed your number? Or you're getting a new phone for Christmas? Did vou somehow miss filling out the paperwork to be on the one-call list? If you have changed carriers since last

you updated your information, please double check to make sure your info is still

Have you filled out the one-call paperwork with HR?

Did you receive a text from School Messenger asking you to opt-in by responding to their message? Did you respond?

Have you changed numbers recently?

Have you changed mobile carriers recently? Sometimes carriers must be told by customers that you want to receive these notifications or they may filter them.
