COMPTON CELEBRATES 30 YEARS AT SCDD

Margaret Compton is one of the first people you will meet when looking for a job at the Scioto County Board of Developmental Disabilities. She works in the Fiscal/HR office and is always there to help staff and the program. She began working for the board on December 4, 1991 and has been a valuable asset since day one. Superintendent, Matt Purcell, who has worked with Margaret in varying capacities over the past 20 years agrees stating, "Margaret has been and continues to be such an asset and a value added employee at the SCDD. The organization, people served and their families, as well as everyone we affiliate with SCDD have certainly been beneficiaries of her skills, knowledge, and abilities!"

In the 30 years that Margaret has worked for SCDD, she has encompassed various roles and seen many changes, but there are a few things that have been constant according to Compton.

"There have been so many changes in philosophy, in service models, and in the expectations of families and service recipients, it's probably impossible to encapsulate them in a short paragraph. So, I'd rather mention two things that have stayed the same. First, the agency's struggle continues every day to move forward, to keep improving, to keep educating, and to find new opportunities. The second thing that has not changed is that there are still people here who do their jobs for the right reasons, with conviction, with heart. I'm happy to say, these people are from every generation. After writing that, it seems wrong to confess that I didn't choose to work for the Board because of its mission. After spending a few years in a corporate setting, I knew I wanted to work for a non-profit when I returned home from California. I had the luxury of waiting until just the right job came along, and government was another form of non-profit to me. It was later that I found my 'why.' My first day on the job, the superintendent introduced me to EVERY person at the workshop all at once. (Dozens were so excited to see him!) I'd never been mobbed before. They were respectful, but their exuberance was still overwhelming. I think that's called an immersive experience nowadays. I wore many hats in those 20 plus years in Superintendent's Office, but my favorite gig was doing the agency's public relations. I got to meet and interact with so many of our folks. It was during that time...you know what I'm going to say; It was the people we served. They became my 'why'. I wanted the public to understand what we do here and to believe that it is valuable. I still believe that, even though I've taken on new challenges in the past six years. That belief is one more thing that hasn't changed."

BRISKER RETIRES

For over 22 years, Sandy Brisker has brought many positive attributes to the people who make up SCDD from helping providers figure out billing to offering a safe place for her coworkers to collaborate and sneak a piece of candy and cup of coffee. However, what had the greatest impact on Sandy was the people served by SCDD. Brisker reflected, "The consumers have impacted my life to its fullest. I have worked in many positions but my memories always go back to the people we serve. I can remember a little guy downstairs coming in off the bus and signing in at the door way every morning like he was a visitor. He went into the school office one day and ask the secretary to call me and wanted to know if anyone needed him. I have watched this little guy grow into a wonderful adult. He could always beat me in Tic Tac Toe. I had several girls that use to come and ask advice on boyfriends. Several talked to me about where to vacation at, some would want advice on buying gifts for people or what was good to eat, or what to put on a grocery list. Many many memories as I reflect back in my 22 years of service."

Brisker added that her work brought challenges, but she used those challenges to grow herself as a person, "My greatest challenge at work was trying to figure out a providers billing when at the time I started this no one had ever done this in their position before. I talked with several providers and the state constantly until I was able to help and even bill for a few of them that were confused with the process. I feel this helped me grow as an individual due to the fact I had to reach out to a lot of people and work with several different personalities."

While being honored at her retirement reception on December 16, 2021 Superintendent Matt Purcell stated, "Sandy has filled so many roles and has acted in so many capacities for this organization and has been so versatile in doing so, In organizations like ours that rely heavily on public dollars, we need people like Sandy. He ended saying, "We are going to surely miss her and she's leaving very large shoes to fill."

Sandy leaves her coworkers with the following advice and sentiments, "You never fail until you try!" she continued, "I love each and everyone of you. I will miss you but it was time to exit. I hope your lives are full with joy and happiness as you all have made mine. I would tell anyone to work in the field of developmental disabilities, it will touch your heart like you would never believe."

VRS PTO BASKET



THE NEW OUTREACH DEPARTMENT



The Outreach Department provides a global philosophical approach to positive culture throughout the Scioto County Board of Developmental Disabilities. Services include:

- Advocacy training and opportunities.
- Coaching and facilitation of the application of positive supports with people served and their caregivers/staff.
- Path to Employment liaison for people served.
- Oversight of the Human Rights Committee's compliance with the DODD Behavioral Support Rule.
- Community Outreach, Public Relations, Communications, & Event Coordination.
- On-going training opportunities for people served, families/caregivers, service providers, and community members.
- SCDD Awareness and Event Planning.

The Outreach Department is made up of a Director, a Coordinator, and 2 Positive Support Facilitators (in the process of being hired!)
