Annual STAR Charity Car Show Proceeds Fund New Riding Mower

## Scioto, Lawrence Boards of DD Share Superintendent

At the Aug. 30 special meeting of the Scioto County Board of Developmental Disabilities, a shared services agreement was approved. This allows Superintendent Julie Monroe to serve the Lawrence County Board of Developmental Disabilities (LCBDD) as interim superintendent.

The agreement, in place for

90 days, calls for Monroe to serve on-site at LCBDD two days per week. LCBDD will reimburse Scioto County for the services.

The agreement of two or more counties sharing a Superintendent is allowed through Ohio Revised Code 5126.0219(A) and (B) and occurs throughout the state both on an interim and permanent

basis. The agreement was made with the assistance of the Ohio Association of County Boards of Developmental Disabilties.

The Scioto County Board of Developmental Disabilities is confident the administrative team is able to manage day-to-day operations of the programs on days Monroe is in Lawrence County.

I'm sure there are folks I am missing, but please know you are appreciated.

Over Labor Day weekend, we braved the remnants of Hurri-

cane Harvey to get word out about SCDD programs and meet our bosses – Scioto County's taxpayers – where they are.
