

Programs and Services

Adult Day Services

Individuals enrolled in the Adult Day Services are assigned an Individual Support Facilitator with whom they meet upon arrival each morning.

Dependent upon the ISP, the individuals engage in various activities throughout the day including music, recreation, art, wood-working, learning centers and computer labs.

These services are located in the STAR, Inc. building and are open from 9 a.m. to 2:45 p.m., Monday-Friday.

STAR, Inc. employment

STAR, Inc., is a private, not-for-profit company that provides employment to individuals with disabilities.

Work enclaves

These are arranged for individuals to work in groups under the supervision of an on-site job coach.

Contracts are established for various type of work including janitorial, lawn care, minor maintenance, etc. Workers receive minimum wage or above. Wages are paid by STAR, Inc.

Community Outreach

Provided through !MPACT, this program provides volunteer opportunities throughout Scioto County under the Portsmouth Kiwanis' AKTION Club.

Community Employment

Through the Community Employment program, area businesses work with STAR, Inc. to employ individuals directly. STAR, Inc. provides continuous support during the individuals employment such as transportation and follow-up training.

Special events

We support individuals with disabilities by building relationships, providing recognition for achievements and connecting them to our community.

Throughout the year, individuals have various opportunities to volunteer in the community, attend dances, sit on local and state committees, attend group outings and receive recognition during banquets.

An overview of services for adults with developmental disabilities.



What is Adult Services?

The Adult Services program provides support and services to individuals, ages 18 and up, who have developmental disabilities.

The program is operated out of the STAR, Inc., building and each individual enrolled in the program is assigned an Individual Support Facilitator (ISF)

The Individual Support Facilitator is responsible for meeting the individuals needs based on an Individual Service Plan (ISP).



What is an Individual Service Plan?

An ISP is developed by a team of experts and includes information obtained by family members and care providers. Individual Service Plans are written by a Service and Support Administrator. Each plan is designed to focus on personal care as well as educational instruction. These plans are customized to meet the individual's needs.

Self-advocacy

Self-advocacy is having the opportunity to know your rights and responsibilities and stand up for them and make choices about your own life. Self-advocacy allows people with disabilities to speak out for themselves. Self-determination focuses on important components such as crafting individualized services plans, providing input and feedback on system changes, legislation and policy.

Programs such as Project STIR (Steps Toward Independence and Responsibility) and the Scioto County Chapter of People 1st meet at STAR Adult Services to encourage and promote Self-advocacy and Self-determination.
