The Scioto County Board of Developmental Disabilities conducted its 2017 organizational meeting on Thursday, Jan. 19, and voted unanimously to keep the current officers in place for another year.

This means Rodney Barnett will remain as president and Mike Thoroughman will stay as vice president. Both members were also sworn in for an additional four-year term by Scioto County Commissioner Bryan Davis. The Scioto County Commissioners appoint local citizens to serve on the Scioto County Board of Developmental Disabilities in accordance with requirements set by state law. In addition to Barnett as president and Thoroughman as vice president, fellow board member Mike Arnett will
